WATER— Florida's Most Precious Resource

With Spring fast approaching or already here, it's time for many to think about working in the yard. The trees are blooming, birds are singing and the temperatures are still "cool" enough to make it enjoyable instead of turning us into a total puddle of sweat.

That said, here are some tips for conserving water in your yard from the Pasco County Government web site: http://www.pascocountyfl.net/index.aspx?NID=194

- Do not use cypress mulch. Using cypress mulch encourages destruction of cypress trees, which are wetland trees.
- Plant it smart! 'Florida-friendly' landscaping is a great way to design, install and maintain both your plants and irrigation system. More importantly, it will save time, money and water. For free information on 'Florida-friendly' landscaping, contact your water management district or your local cooperative extension service.
- Plant native and/or drought-tolerant grasses, ground covers, shrubs and trees. Once estab-

lished, they do not need water as frequently and usually will survive a dry period without watering.

- Put the right plant in the right place! Group plants together based on similar water needs into zones.
- Use a rain barrel / cistern to harvest rainwa-

or planter beds. Rain barrels like this can be made from 50 to 55 gallon food-grade drums. Larger containers are available and affordable too. An example of this functioning rain barrel is located at the Dade City Cooperative Extension Service Office.

• Use mulch to retain moisture in the soil. Mulch also helps control weeds that compete with landscape plants for water.

Pondless Water Feature Child safety, low maintenance among benefits

There's nothing quite like the sound of water bubbling in your back (or front) yard. A water feature can become an eye-catching landscaping feature, or a cool and tranquil

backdrop that also helps block unwanted traffic or neighborhood noise.

A water feature can also be a great do-it-

yourself project that just about anyone can tackle.

The term "water feature" can mean different things to different people. But if you want a stunning, low-maintenance option that's customized to your yard and your

style, consider going "pondless."
Also known as a "disappearing pond,"
pondless water features eliminate the
open pond that requires periodic mainte-

nance to prevent algae and other problems, along with potential safety issues for small children. Instead, they use a water reservoir, a recirculating pump, and some type of rock or other

feature that the water flows out of. The water filters down through a rock base over the reservoir and disappears, to be recycled endlessly. The pondless water feature pictured above is located in Oak Ridge subdivision. This dual-spillway water feature was designed and built by a local contractor, **Joe Cunningham**, who

owns Nature Rocks! Joe provided excellent advice, knowledge and experience in the area of landscaping and water feature mechanics. I wouldn't hesitate to use him for additional work or recommend him to friends, neighbors, or family. Joe's email address is: pond-lessyardstreams@hotmail.com

Mandy Stephens, the Project Coordinator for Pasco County recycling provided an update on the County's ef-

fort to reduce county expenses thru recycling.

"Our effort to improve on Pasco County's "Curb Your Blues" program (continues). Currently, this program allows for certain citizens to recycle eligible items at their residential curb. If you re-

ceive twice a week residential curbside trash pick up, you are eligible for twice a month curbside recycling. Items that are currently eligible for this program include plastics #1 &

#2, aluminum cans, metal food cans, and clear, green, and brown glass bottles and jars. We have a new pro-

gram on the horizon, "Curb It Pasco". With this new program, we hope to expand the type of recycling to include one thru five, and seven (thus excluding #6 which is mostly styrofoam). We also hope to allow residents to put their recycled goods into ANY type of container; this container will need to have a special reflective sticker

attached to it that allows your trash hauling company to identify the container in the early dark morning hours. You (i.e. the resident) would supply the container and your trash hauling company would supply the

reflective sticker. However, you are allowed to continue using your blue bag(s) if you wish. There is no date set for implementation of this new program. Please feel free to call our office later this year for a date".

"Newspaper in Education is an insert that will be included in the Tampa Bay Times on April 21. This insert, as well as Earth Day on April 27 at Crews Lake Park, promotes environmental awareness and sustainability in children and adults. Earth Day is a family event that includes food, entertainment, games, and vendors. Some things that were done in the past have included a rain barrel workshop, a composting workshop, alligator encounters, and a mercury bounty collection." Contact Mandy at (727) 856-4539

To be eligible to vote, you can join the Oak Ridge Homeowners Association using 1 of the 3 methods:


